



JOB DESCRIPTION FOR LEARNING SUPPORT TEACHER

The Learning Support teacher is responsible for teaching students with learning disabilities to succeed in school. He/she will work with students who have cognitive, physical, or emotional issues that impact their ability to learn in traditional ways. The Learning Support teacher will provide remedial instruction in math and reading and will monitor student progress. The L.S. teacher must keep meticulous records to track student progress and maintain close contact with the classroom teacher, as well as parents.

The ideal candidate will have a minimum of two years' experience in a special education setting and will be familiar with the federal laws associated with special education. A bachelor's degree and teaching credential is required, a master's degree is preferred, but not required.

Candidates must have knowledge of the Catholic faith and be willing to abide by the guidelines and standards set forth by the school.
